McGuffey High School - Academic Requirements

(A) Academic Requirements for Graduation

- 1. Twenty Six Credits or Fifteen and a Half Credits and Completion of WACTC Program.
- 2. Successfully completed a Culminating Graduation Project (CGP).
- 3. Beginning with the Class of 2017 all students must pass the designated Pennsylvania Keystone Assessments in Algebra I, Literature, and Biology in order to graduate from high school in Pennsylvania.
- 4. A student who do not pass any one of the three Pennsylvania Keystone Assessments may be scheduled into a remediation course for the purpose of completing a Project Based Assessment (PBA), as required by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The PBA is a series of online modules that must be completed and submitted for review to the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Each PBA requires 15 20 hours to complete under the direction of a faculty member during school hours.
